Clear out clutter, pass along items you no longer need. Item donations are wanted and welcome. There will also be a collection bin for any food bank items guests wish to bring which will later be delivered to the community Food Bank in Provo.

Please do not dump after hours. After hours & illegal dumping results in thousands of dollars of expenses for Orem taxpayers and possible discontinuance of the program.

Orem residents can take GREEN WASTE directly to the transfer station for FREE at any time. The North Pointe Transfer Station is located at 2000 W 200 S Lindon, UT

Spring Clean-Up Program Rules

- Dumpsters will be available Mon. – Fri. from 8am to 7pm. Saturday from 8am to 3pm. No after-hours dumping is permitted.
- Regular trash, green waste, and metal recycling dumpsters will be on site.
- Orem residents can use any dumpster any week regardless of home address.
- City employees will monitor dumping to prevent cross contamination.

Items that may NOT be Placed in the Clean-Up Dumpsters

There are some things that can't be placed in the dumpsters, but here's what you can do with those things.

- Paint – must be dried out prior to disposal. Kitty litter or sawdust can be added to help dry out paint faster.
- Tires – haul directly to North Pointe (cost per tire) or check with your local tire shop
- Auto Parts & Batteries – MCR Recycling
- Electronics – North Pointe – Your free trash pass will cover the first \$11, then \$10 per additional item or Best Buy (\$25 per computer)
- Fluorescent Bulbs – North Pointe (\$.30 per foot) or Batteries Plus
- Refrigerators – North Pointe (\$15 per unit)
- Used Oil – Orem Public Works (up to 5 gallons) – Larger amounts to Rock Canyon Oil or Emerald Recycling
- Concrete (pieces thicker than 12 inches) – North Pointe – concrete, bricks, or rocks can be dumped in a special “clean-fill” area. The charge for a pure load of clean fill debris, equal to a level pickup load is \$12. Clean loads larger than a pickup size load are \$12 per ton. Concrete containing rebar is \$28.50 per ton. Any concrete 12” thick or larger cannot be accepted
- Mattresses – North Pointe (\$10 per mattress) – Your free trash pass will cover the first 2 mattresses

Orem Spring Clean-Up FREE TRASH PASS Pass Expires 8/31/24

Pass is good for up to 500 lbs of household trash. Loads should be stacked no higher than the sides of the vehicle bed or trailer. All loads must be covered as required by the transfer station. For larger loads, this pass will only cover the first \$11.00 of the station's fees and the user must pay the difference.

Multiple dump passes CANNOT be combined to pay for larger loads

Accessory dwelling annual fee was eliminated. Orem's utility rates are the lowest in Utah County.</p> <p>The most extensive review and evaluation of all city departments is currently underway to optimize all areas of the city.</p> <p>Orem citizens now have a one-stop shop to see everything their city and elected officials are doing, including a complete record of every vote taken by the city council.</p> <p>Orem has received over \$21 million in grants with another \$7.6 million pending. Orem's success rate of winning grants is 89%.</p> <p>Through restructuring and operational efficiencies, Orem residents are now saving \$1.1 million that can be used for high priority projects.</p> <p>Mayor Young & staff secured \$2 million from Utah County to add baseball/softball turf, soccer turf, and new lighting to Lakeside Park. It can now be used year round and for national tournaments.</p> <p>A brand new, state-of-the-art, \$30 million City Hall is being built with no new taxes and no bonding. Most cities will tell you this is not possible. Mayor Young secured a \$10 million grant and staff got a \$3 million grant to save taxpayers \$13 million on this project.</p> <p>The Orem Land Preservation Act established extra protections to preserve all public lands such as schools, parks, and city owned property from being developed for non-public purposes.</p> <p>An independent survey of city employees with 95% participation showed that 80% believe the city is headed in the right direction and 92% say city leaders lead with integrity.</p> <p>New plan changes the focus from previous plans. This one focuses on family neighborhoods and preserving communities and enhancing safety.</p> <p>City Council ended the State Street Master Plan and eliminated 10,000 high-density apartments along State Street. New focus is on service, office, and retail development.</p> <p>By combining emergency dispatch with Provo, both cities benefit from lower costs and improved service.</p> <p>Increased size from 3x5 to 5x8 so they stand out better and are more readable.</p> <p>New and renewed efforts to preserve and celebrate Orem's rich history are now underway.</p> <p>The 0.01% sales tax that makes awesome arts and recreation projects happen in Orem was renewed for another 10 years.</p>
