REINVESTING IN OREM'S UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE

- Orem has enjoyed some of the lowest utility rates in the state for many years. Much like your house needs new roofing, plumbing, and appliances, the time has come to update Orem's infrastructure.
- An independent engineering firm has performed an in-depth analysis of Orem's drinking, storm, and waste water systems and found that there are major infrastructure issues that need immediate attention.
- The proposed plan is "pay-as-you-go" which will enable the city to complete these projects entirely **debt free**.
- To make the necessary improvements, utility bills need to increase an average of \$9.32 per month, each year, for the next 5 years.



Public meetings and open houses concerning this project will also be held to learn more about proposed rate increases.

The city will be sending you more detailed, utility rate-specific information about these projects as well as dates and times for meetings in the coming weeks.

OREM SPRING CLEANING · FREE DUMP PASS

Pass is good for one pickup truck or single-axle trailer load of mixed HOUSEHOLD TRASH. Loads should be stacked no higher than the sides of the vehicle bed or trailer. All loads must be covered as required by the transfer station. For larger loads, this pass will only cover the first \$7.00 of the station's fee and the user must pay the difference.

Multiple dump passes CANNOT be combined to pay for larger loads
